Notes from the Mayor

Welcome to the Fall! And with the change of seasons, comes more change to Betterton. Please welcome our new Town Manager, Mrs. Elizabeth Greenwell and our new Town Clerk, Ms. Sheila Dlugoborski. Elizabeth comes to us with a background as an educator and has jumped in with both feet to hit the ground running. Sheila, who takes over after Mrs. Shirley Crater decided that she wanted to ease back on her workload and retire, comes to us with previous experience as a Town Clerk for Rock Hall. She has also hit the ground running and both are working hard to keep the Town moving forward. Please stop by the office and welcome them.

Speaking of the office, we have changed the hours that the office is open. The new hours are listed below and were done to have the office open on a more consistent basis. Also, this is the first billing with the new Water and Sewer Rates, which were raised in anticipation of the cost increase from the construction of the new Wastewater Treatment Plant.

The new rates are:

Water - \$59.50/quarter

Sewer - \$142.50/ quarter

(For the first 12,000 gallons of usage).

For each 1,000 gallons of usage over the base amount, the current \$15.00 /1000 gal. charge will be added.

Note that these rates apply to those served within Town Limits. Those served outside of Town Limits will pay at the standard one and one half times the new rates. As for the new wastewater treatment plant, construction is progressing and they are working to a completion by August of 2018. With an estimated cost of \$10,050,336.00 and a 16 month construction time frame, this new plant will reduce the nitrogen and phosphorus content of our effluent aiding in the goals of improving the Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries.

Again to reiterate, that the construction site access is restricted to authorized personnel only. Any unauthorized personnel may be charged with trespassing. Also, due to the site design and security requirements, the gravel lane that had connected Third Avenue and Second Avenue at Glenn Street will be closed. It will no longer open to the public as a thoroughfare through the Town property.
